Arcep launches a public consultation on the procedures for assigning frequencies in the 700 MHz and 3.4 – 3.8 GHz bands in Guiana

Paris, 10 January 2022

On 10 January 2022, Arcep launched a public consultation on the draft award procedures for awarding 700 MHz and 3.4 - 3.8 GHz band frequencies in Guiana. Stakeholders have until 25 February 2022 to submit their contributions.

This public consultation is part of the process of assigning new frequency bands for the deployment of public mobile networks in France's overseas departments and territories, to be able to satisfy the ever-growing needs of consumer and business users wanting to access high quality and reliable superfast mobile services.

The planned assignment conditions and procedures align with the guidelines set forth by the Government in a letter written by Sébastien Lecornu, Minister for Overseas France, and Cédric O, Secretary of State for the Digital Transition and Electronic Communications. These guidelines seek to promote regional digital development and to ensure fair and effective competition in Guiana. These conditions and procedures include a series of provisions designed to improve mobile coverage and connectivity in this territory, which were established in close collaboration with local authorities.

Contributions to the public consultations will enable Arcep to finalise these award procedures. Arcep will then submit its final text to the Government, with a view to conducting these award procedures in 2022.
